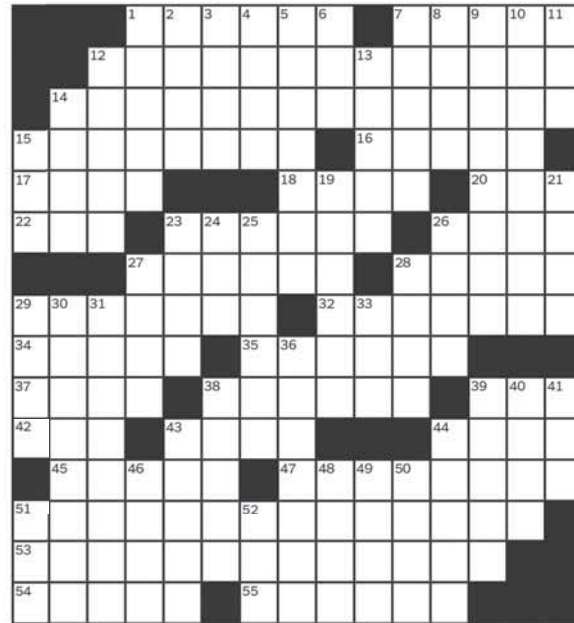

# Bust a move at free Bay Area Dance Week

Bay Area Dance Week kicks off on Friday, and everyone is invited to participate.

The 19th annual event, presented by Dancers' Group, offers nearly 400 free dance events across the region, for folks of all levels, during 10 days of festivities.

Organizers call it "one of the nation's largest, most joyful and inclusive celebrations of movement and dance," and Wayne Hazzard, executive director of the nonprofit service organization Dancers' Group, says this year's programming feels "more important than ever," offering "an opportunity to celebrate our differences by coming together in dance, regardless of cultural background, race, faith or gender."

Among the large gatherings in the lineup is the opener, "One Dance," a flash mob slated for noon Friday at San Francisco City Hall.

Dancers who want to join can learn the moves online from a terrific step-by-step video featuring Dudley Flores, artistic director of Rhythm & Motion, a workout program with the motto "anyone can dance."

A few awards are being handed out on Friday, too. Mix'd Ingrdnts Dance Company, a collective of women dancing in all styles founded by Jennifer "Jenay" Anolin and Samara Atkins, will be honored, as well Deborah Vaughn, director of Dimensions Dance Theater.

Hundreds of offerings fall into groups. San Francisco events for first-timers include "Pre-Beginner
